

Catholic board names top Scarborough student

The Toronto Catholic District School Board (TCDSB) released its list of the top graduating students across the city this week, and Leroy Gonsalves-Prabhu from Pope John Paul II Catholic Secondary School ranked first among his classmates in Scarborough.

With a final overall average of 97.33 per cent, Gonsalves-Prabhu was awarded for his diligent studies by York University with a full scholarship. He will study at York's Schulich School of Business

this fall.

Meanwhile, in rankings city-wide, Etobicoke's Bishop Allen Academy bred the top three graduating students in the TCDSB this year.

With a perfect average of 100 per cent, Jana Cmorejova achieved the highest average of all Grade 12 graduating students for the 2008-'09 academic year. Cmorejova will attend McMaster University in the fall, where she will study health sciences on a \$3,000 entrance scholarship.

Ania Ochocinski placed

second with an average of 99.83 per cent, and is set to attend Queen's University for the concurrent education program with the aid of both a \$5,000 entrance scholarship and a \$1,975 Janet and Thomson McLaughlin Award from Queen's.

Finally, Olga Paprotska is the third-place overall top student with an average of 99.33 per cent. She belonged to the school's choir for three years and Students Concerned about Oppression of People and the Environment.
