How to use Summer Playground

Every week throughout the summer, a new choice board will be posted for each divisional group. The choice boards will contain a variety of cross-curricular activities that are designed around a big idea for the week.


For the highest engagement, have your child select the activities of their choice. You can always challenge them to complete the board like "Tic Tac Toe" and get 3 in a row. Please consider [sharing your learning](#) with us! This link is at the bottom of each choice board.

How to Help and Support your Child's Learning

We recognize that ALL students learn in their own unique way. You may wish to adapt the posted activities to better suit your child's specific needs, interests and learning style. You are welcome to complete as many or as few activities as you'd like! **This should be a positive experience for all of you!**

For those students who currently have an Individual Education Plan (IEP), you are encouraged to consider using the accommodations that are documented by your child's teacher in your child's IEP. Below are some examples of possible accommodations (but not limited to this list) to help support your child in learning at home:

- Reduce the number of questions/tasks per concept/skill as required (e.g. student completes only 1 out of the 3 questions assigned)
- Extra time to complete the assigned task (there is no time limit, you can do week 2 activities in week 7!)

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- Use of computer or assistive technology (e.g. Read&Write Google with Text-to-Speech, Speech-to-text) [Assistive Technology - Google Read and Write](#)
 - If possible, try to provide a quiet space, free from distractions (e.g. encourage your child to be in an environment that allows for limited distraction and is conducive for learning)
 - Allow for breaks between work periods (e.g. (movement breaks, deep breathing/meditation breaks) [Tension Release Exercises](#))
 - Highlight important information (e.g. highlight important details when reading a text, or highlight words that your child needs to clarify the meaning of, use different colours to highlight mathematical symbols and signs +, - etc)
 - Allow your child to demonstrate their learning in various ways: discuss answers orally, write down your child's oral responses, or ask your child to draw a picture to illustrate learning
