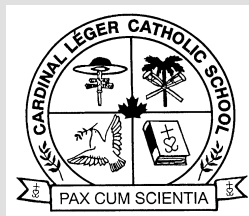

Appropriate Dress Code Policy Navy and White @ Cardinal Leger

<p>Plain white or plain navy tops include: Short and long-sleeved t-shirts, short and long-sleeve golf shirts, dress shirts, blouses, turtle necks, hoodies, vests, cardigans, sweaters or sweatshirts</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sleeves required • With or without collars • No visible labels, logos, contrasting colours, coloured buttons, coloured stitching, stripes, words, pictures or detailing
<p>Plain navy blue bottoms include: Pants, shorts, skorts, skirts, tunic dress, dress, capri/cargo pants, track, athletic pants</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Walking/athletic shorts are to be mid-thigh or longer • Skorts are skirts with shorts sewn inside • Cargo pants are ¾ length pants or full length pants that the bottoms can be zipped off (or rolled up) to make them into shorts • Track pants: with tight elastic bottoms or loose open bottoms • Skirts & tunic dresses should be modest length (knee or slightly above knee) • Wearing shorts underneath skirts and dresses is recommended but not required • Tunic dresses are solid plain navy blue and worn with plain white or plain navy tops underneath • No visible labels, logos, contrasting colours, coloured buttons, coloured stitching, stripes, words, pictures or detailing
<p>Other clothing items include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tights, socks and leggings • Shoes • Belts • Clothing accessories 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Girls' pants can be plain white or plain navy blue • Socks (that are visible) can be solid white or solid navy blue • Leggings can be solid white or solid navy blue and are permitted under skirts and dresses, and under tops to mid thigh for all ages. Girls from JK-3 are permitted to also wear leggings as pants. • Shoes should be suitable for recess, gym and physical activity – running shoes are recommended, secure sandals when weather appropriate • Belts are optional. Belts can be plain black or navy blue • Over-garments are to be plain white, navy blue or plain white • Clothing accessories should be plain navy or white

What is **not** included / What **not** to wear

- The only requirement for Physical Education (PE) class is that garments be navy and/or white. It is mandatory to change for Grades 4-8 for PE class. Footwear for Physical Education includes non-slip, non-marking soles (running shoes)
- There is no dress code requirement for clothing worn outdoors, including jackets, snow pants, hats, gloves, epi pen pouches, etc.
- **It is recommended that parents / families label all clothing pieces clearly**
- Denim/jeans cannot be worn (as mandated by TCDSB)
- Hats and sunglasses are only to be worn outdoors (outdoor wear)
- Flip flops and slip on sandals without straps are not recommended
- Mini-skirts, halter-tops, spaghetti straps, tank tops, muscle shirts, t-shirts with writing tights & leggings
- Clothing with tears/holes
- Oversized clothing (shirts to the knee, pants hanging low and off the waist)
- Undergarments must not be visible

Spirit Wear (Cardinal Leger Crested Pieces) – Optional Additional Dress Code Garments

- Cardinal Spirit Wear is permitted to wear on any day. Crested clothing may be purchased from a Cardinal Leger Spirit Wear Supplier (i.e. McCarthy's or Eagle Beaver) for:
 - A standard navy or white garment
 - Two additional Spirit Wear **options** are also available:
 - Crested Powder Blue overgarment (available through Eagle Beaver)
 - Cardinal Leger Kilt (although not crested, a standard navy kilt is available through McCarthy's)

Dress Down Days

During the year, dress-down or non-dress code days will be planned. These days will be announced (i.e. in the Week at a Glance / "The SCOOP") throughout the year, so parents and students can be prepared. Students have the option of wearing the dress code or regular clothes, which may include coloured clothing, denim/jeans, and logos. All other guidelines for what is not included should be followed. Students should be modestly dressed in keeping with our Catholic values.

Are YOU ready for BLUE?

(1) Crested Items (sometimes called Spirit Wear) / Phys Ed Apparel

On September 05 & June 29 – if you are interested in Crested pieces, hopefully you checked out the McCarthy's Sale in the Gym and the Eagle Beaver sale.

Please note, there are great pricing discounts when you purchase multiple items and our suppliers provide a "benefit" back to the school which will be put toward donating navy and white clothing to families in need.

(4) Get to know your Policy

Please do get to know the Cardinal Leger Navy and White Dress Code Policy so that you don't run into any surprise. The policy is available on the Cardinal Leger School Website

(<http://www.tcdsb.org/schools/cardinalleger.asp>) and in the Parent's Handbook that was handed out in

September. Here are a few highlights:

- (1) The policy has been crafted so that it is "as open" as possible. This means that students can wear navy or white t-shirts or collared shirts – as long as they do not have a logo or contrasting colours.
- (2) If your family is interested in a crested item, you must buy that crested piece / spirit wear (I.e. It has the Cardinal Leger logo on it) from one of our two suppliers: McCarthy's for "every day" navy and white, kilts - Eagle Beaver for powder blue sweatshirts and physical education wear
- (3) Socks should be plain navy or plain white.
- (4) Shoes can be any colour – but try to ensure that they are suitable for physical activity.
- (5) Belts are entirely optional – but must be plain white or plain navy.

(6) Clothing accessories should be plain navy or plain white.

(7) Don't forget – what the students wear during Physical Education should also be white or navy on top and navy on the bottom.

Use of the Internet

With the beginning of summer holidays, many students may be spending more time in front of their computers, surfing the Internet for information and entertainment, and chatting with their friends online. We would encourage all parents/guardians to remain vigilant and to monitor the online activities of their children.



It has been brought to the Board's attention that on occasion individual students, or groups of students, have created their own websites and posted photographs and other personal information about themselves and/or about their friends. Whenever this type of activity is brought to the attention of the

school or the school board, parents are contacted immediately. Often these websites have been developed without the parents' knowledge or approval.

While at school, students adhere to the Board's Acceptable Use Policy, and online activities are strictly monitored. Internet safety is discussed with students at age-appropriate levels at various times during the school year.

It is important for young people to be reminded about the dangers of posting personal information and photographs on public websites, which are accessible to anyone with a computer. Although often an innocent attempt at sharing favourite pictures with friends, these websites may invite negative attention.


Efforts are already underway to ensure a smooth transition over the summer months in preparation for the beginning of the 2017-2018 academic year in September.

APPOINTMENT OF NEW ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR OF ACADEMIC AFFAIRS AND CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER (COO)

We are pleased to announce the appointment of Dan Koenig as Associate Director, Academic Affairs and Chief Operating Officer (COO) effective August 1, 2017. This decision is the result of a competitive hiring process undertaken by Board staff and members of the Board of Trustees.

As a highly respected educator, Mr. Koenig is a key member of the Board's Senior Leadership Team, serving in various roles over the past six years, most recently as the Superintendent of Human Resources and Labour Relations.

Mr. Koenig attended MSSB/TCDSB schools (St. Jerome and Chaminade College), prior to obtaining his Bachelor and Masters of Education from the University of Toronto. A Catholic educator with the Toronto Catholic District School Board for more than 30 years, Mr. Koenig first joined the Board in 1985 as a teacher at St. Cyprian Catholic School.

His impressive record of professional experience includes serving as the Board's Superintendent of Curriculum and Accountability, Superintendent of Schools (Area 7), Program Coordinator (Health/Physical/Outdoor/Arts), School Principal (St. Brendan CS) and Vice-Principal (St. Maria Goretti CS). SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM THROUGH TORONTO PUBLIC HEALTH

According to the Immunization of School Pupils Act, 1982 parents/guardian are required "...to complete the prescribed program of immunization..." for each pupil. Failure to do so will result in suspension and /or exclusion from school. You are urged to make sure you're your child has the required up-to-date immunization. Each year, Toronto Public Health offers hepatitis B & meningococcal vaccines to all grade 7 students, and the Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine to all grade 8 female students. As applicable, your child's vaccination consent package will be sent home. Upon receipt of the consent package, please complete and return to the school.

Vaccinations will be administered in our School Atrium the morning of Monday, October 23, 2017.

ALLERGIES

Many of our students suffer from various types of allergies. In particular, allergies to peanuts and nuts are life threatening to some of our students. The safety of our children is paramount, therefore I am requesting that students **do not bring food or treats to school with traces of peanuts or nuts.**

Always read ingredient listings as recipes and manufacturing processes are subject to change without notice.

All School Visitors Report To The School Office

To help maintain the security of our school yard and building for the safety of our children, all visitors are to report to the school office upon arrival.

Parent visitors wishing to meet with a teacher or the principal are asked to arrange a mutually convenient time to meet.

EpiPen Reminders

Parents are asked to replace expired EpiPens for home and school use. Students with anaphylaxis are to have a minimum of two (2) EpiPens at the school and with them on trips. It is advisable for a parent or other relative of an anaphylactic student to attend class trips.

SAFETY

Dropping off (morning entry) and pick up times (afternoon dismissal) are very busy times.

We ask parents to be very careful when moving through the Kiss & Ride.

- ✓ ***Parents/guardians parking in the school parking lot at entry and dismissal times creates undue vehicle congestion and elevates the risk of student and adult injury.*** Additionally, the congestion prevents emergency vehicles (fire truck/ambulance/police) from having access to the rear of our building/property.
- ✓ ***Parents/guardians please do not park in the school parking lot during morning entry and afternoon dismissal times.***
- ✓ Parents/guardians should seek a parking location on a neighbouring street and walk your child(ren) to and from the school.
- ✓ **Please use sidewalks for walking.**
- ✓ ***For Safety reasons, do not walk through our school parking lot.***
