

PATHWAYS TO BACHELOR OF NURSING and PRACTICAL NURSING PROGRAMS

Program: Pre-Health Pathway to Advanced Diplomas and Degrees - PH111

Length: 8 months (September – April)

Admission Requirements: **MANDATORY** pre-admission test in English (essay writing) and math only.

It is expected that graduates of Pre-Health Sciences Pathway to Advanced Diplomas and Degrees program will be eligible to apply for admission to Advanced Diploma or Degree programs, as well as Certificate and Diploma programs within two broad fields: health sciences, as well as general sciences. These would include: Humber/UNB Bachelor of Nursing, Practical Nursing, Pharmacy Technician, OTA/PTA, Fitness and Health Promotion, Massage Therapy and more. You may also be eligible to receive transfer credits.

BACHELOR OF NURSING PATHWAY

For admission into the program, students **must** successfully complete the two semesters of Pre-Health Sciences Pathway to Advanced Diplomas and Degrees program with a **minimum overall GPA of 75%**, including **minimum 75% final grade in each the following subjects:**

- GBIO 100: Biology
- GBIO 150: Biology 2
- GCHM 100: Chemistry
- GCHM 150: Chemistry 2
- GMTH 150: Math for Sciences 1
- GMTH 250: Math for Sciences 2
- GCOM 110: Writing for the Sciences 1
- GCOM 220: Writing for the Sciences 2

Transfer Credits: To qualify for transfer credits, student must obtain a final mark of **75%** in the following courses:

Admission Requirements:

To be eligible for the Practical Nursing program, ALL applicants are required to write the **MANDATORY pre-admission testing in senior-level Biology, Chemistry, Math and Writing skills** (testing fee will be charged).

Completion of below courses will help prepare for the test:

- Grade 12 English
- Grade 11 or Grade 12 Biology
- Grade 11 or Grade 12 Chemistry
- Grade 12 Mathematics

The tests are multiple choice format except for writing sample. These are computer based. No Calculators will be allowed for the test.

Admission Requirements:

High School Applicants:

- Grade 12 U level *English, Chemistry, Biology,* and *Math* with a minimum of 75% in each course.
- Two Grade 12 U/ M Electives a minimum of 60% in each course (from approved list).

Mature Applicants (applicants 21 years of age with no post-secondary education and/or post-secondary education over 5 years):

- Grade 12 U level *English, Chemistry, Biology,* and *Math* with a minimum of 75% in each course.
- Preference may be given to applicants who completed the courses listed on a full-time basis and on the first attempt.

Transfer Applicants (applicants with post-secondary education within the last 5 years):

- 3.0 minimum GPA in post-secondary studies
- Grade 12 U level *English, Chemistry, Biology,* and *Math* with a minimum of 75% in each course.

Please note: The Bachelor of Nursing is full disclosure, which means that ALL post-secondary transcripts must be submitted.

Students must satisfy Humber's *English Language Proficiency Policy*.

Meeting the minimum grade does not guarantee admission to the program



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
