Bus Students:

Students who are bussed to school should take the bus on a regular basis. Students are asked to be at their bus stop 5 minutes before pick up time. School staff supervise students getting on and off the bus at school.

Please be aware that students who are not currently on a bus list are not permitted on the bus for any reason due to liability issues. Students may only take the bus on which they have been assigned.

Bus Transportation Information and Updates:

Communications with parents regarding bus transportation for students is a priority. In order to stay informed, parents are encouraged to register on the Toronto Student Transportation Group (TSTG) portal today by visiting www.torontoschoolbus.org. This portal provides TCDSB parents with online access to their children's transportation information and up to the minute email notifications regarding school bus cancellations or delays. If you have any issues signing up on the portal, please contact support@torontoschoolbus.org and staff will assist you with the registration of your account.



Inclement Weather

The students will be permitted to enter the school building and go directly to their classroom at 8:15 a.m. on days when the weather is inclement. During recesses students will be supervised inside their classrooms. Unless the weather is particularly bad, cold weather does not warrant an early entry into the building or indoor recess. Please make sure your children are dressed appropriately for the weather.

Supervision At School:

General yard supervision at school begins at **8:15 a.m.** Children should not be left unattended prior to this time. Parents are expected to make pick up arrangements for 3:00 p.m. dismissal. Please pick up students promptly at this time.

We kindly request that parents/caregivers do not enter the school yard during supervision times from **8:15 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.** throughout the school day. Please also note that parents/caregivers should not approach students, stand watching or photographing students on school premises. We thank you for your support as it assists staff in stranger identification.

Additional Drop-off and Pick-up Safety Tips for Parents/Caregivers:

- Each morning make sure your child knows **who** will be meeting them and **where** to meet.
- Prepare for unforeseen events that may cause you to be late. Encourage your child to report to the staff member on duty or go to the office via the front/main school entrance door when they do not see the adult who is picking them up at dismissal time.
- Students old enough to travel to and from school on their own are encouraged to walk home with a partner or in a group.



Student Pick-up and Drop Off:

This is a gentle reminder to encourage everyone to maintain a safe, welcoming and respectful environment by taking note of signage regarding any parking or stopping restrictions. Please avoid parking in any area that would block cars parked in designated parking spots, the fire route, drop off loop or that restricts the flow of traffic. **We have been notified by the Toronto Police Parking Enforcement that they will be coming around to ticket vehicles that do not obey parking signage/laws and fines begin at \$250.** If you need to drop off/pick up your child, please park in a designated parking spot, be actively engaged in picking up/dropping off in the loop or make arrangements to pick up/drop off your child at another location.



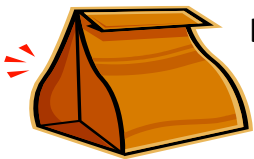
Student Safety Patrollers:

Many thanks for the positive feedback from our community regarding our Student Safety Patroller Program which started in the spring of 2015. St. Henry is the second Catholic School in the TCDSB that has started a Student Safety Patroller program which is supported by the Toronto Police and CAA. Our Student Safety Patrollers receive training from the Toronto Police.

We will be looking for students from Gr. 5-8 to volunteer their time before and after school to help students get to and from school safely. Permission forms will be available in the office and are requested to be submitted by **Friday, September 13th**.

Provided we are able to get Student volunteers, the Student Safety Patrollers will be available in the front of the school to help students dropped off/picked up at the loop and arriving/departing from the buses. The Student Safety Patrollers can be identified by their bright yellow vests.

Please note the following: Parents/Guardians are asked to assist their own children in/out of vehicles on the passenger side of the car to/from the sidewalk in our Drop Off/Pick Up Loop. Safety Patrollers can escort children to the Kindergarten yard from the Drop Off/Pick Up Loop once parents have safely assisted their children onto the sidewalk.



Lunch Drop Offs:

Children should come with their lunch in the morning. However, at times you may find it necessary to drop off a lunch. If so, please:

- Keep lunch drop-offs to a minimum (special occasions, emergency)
- Deliver the lunch to Lunch Table in the Office before 11:15 a.m.
- Write your child's name on the lunch bag.
- Tell your child to check the Lunch Table in advance.



Administration of Medication

If it is necessary that your child take medication at school, it is the Board's policy that parents submit the completed **Request and Consent for the Administration of Oral Medication** form. Medication must have the doctor's name clearly printed on the pharmaceutical label. These forms, which are available from the school office, must be completed and signed by the parent before the medicine is administered.

Please Do Not send medication to the school with your child without first notifying the school and completing the forms. All medication is sent to the office for safe keeping.



Anaphylactic/Nut Aware Environment:

Please note that **nuts or nut products are not allowed on school premises or on school excursions** in an attempt to provide a nut free environment for community members with life threatening allergies.

Please note the following safety precautions:

- No food is permitted in the classroom for general consumption unless it is permitted by the classroom teacher or principal.
- **Do not send food** for class consumption without checking with the teacher first to avoid any potential disappointment for the child if the item is unable to be consumed.
- **Any food for general consumption must be commercially packaged and clearly labeled as nut free.**
- **Homemade food cannot be permitted for general consumption** as we are unable to ensure it is nut free and was made in a nut free environment.

Many thanks for assisting staff in their attempts to make St. Henry a safe environment for all.

This year we are fortunate to have Mrs. Canaguarium and Mr. Zavackis share the role of Nutrition Coordinator. We would also like to thank Ms. Hoda Dandan who volunteers in our Nutrition Program and is one of our Regular Lunch Time Supervisors. We are happy to announce that the Nutrition program will begin on **Monday, September 9th, 2019** with snacks given to our students at about **9:30 a.m. daily.**

The intention of the Nutrition Program is to provide a healthy morning snack/meal that is available to all St. Henry students. Studies have shown that student Nutrition programs help increase student achievement. We have been able to secure Grants and funding raised by our Parent Community through our Parent Council to start up this program again this year as we had in the past. Going forward we may need to ask for donations from our St. Henry families in order to maintain this service. **Please fill out the form attached to this newsletter and return it to the school as soon as possible if you would like to inform our Nutrition Coordinators of any allergies, dietary restrictions or if you would not like your child to participate, otherwise your child will automatically be served the snack.**

Terry Fox is a great Canadian hero. After being diagnosed with bone cancer in 1977, and having his right leg amputated above the knee, he decided to run across Canada to raise money for cancer research. He called his journey the Marathon of Hope. With determination, he ran an average of 42 km every day for 143 days. Terry was forced to stop his run in September 1980 when the cancer spread to his lungs. Terry died in June 1981.

Let's keep Terry's dream to find a cure for cancer alive! **For more information about Terry Fox, visit www.terryfox.org**. St. Henry will be having its annual Terry Fox Walk on **Thursday, September 26th** in the morning. Students are asked to wear **Red & White**, the colours of the Canadian flag, to honour one of Canada's greatest heroes. The students will be walking in support of cancer research. **Each student is asked to bring in a suggested donation of a toonie (\$2)** but any donation would be appreciated for the Terry Fox Foundation. Last year, our Terry Fox Walk raised **\$380.30** and our school community has raised about \$ 51, **181.05** in total for the Terry Fox Foundation since 1983.
