## **MONDAY, OCT. 30-MONDAY, NOV 6: POST-HALLOWE'EN HARD CANDY COLLECTION FOR CANADIAN FOOD FOR CHILDEN**

(No soft candy, powdered candy, soft toffee, gum, chocolate, or chips, please)

**Hard Candy examples:** Hard lifesavers, *Werther's Original* HARD (not soft) caramels, *tic tac*, plain lollipops (no gum or toffee).

Canadian Food For Children (CFFC) is a registered charity with the Canadian government. Their goal is to feed the poor. All donations collected go towards feeding the poorest of the poor in developing countries throughout the world, such as El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Peru, Philippines, and Sierra Leone. CFFC is entirely run by Canadian volunteers and no one gets paid.

### **Why Hard Candy???**

The WE Ambassadors have learned that most of the children being fed by the CFFC are suffering from malnutrition and/or starvation. If food is given to them initially, their stomachs would not be prepared to digest it. Sucking on a hard candy before eating food, helps produce more saliva which then helps these children digest their food. Since this candy is being transported overseas it cannot melt or get spoiled, therefore, we ask that no soft candy, gum, powdered candy, chocolate or chips be donated; only **HARD CANDY** please.
