- Register is on sale at St. Peter's, Holy Rosary, St. Cecilia's, St. Vincent de Paul's Church, St. Stanislaus Kostka, St. Josephat's.
- Fr. Minehan and a deputation from the St. Vincent de Paul Parish have requested a new 4-room **school**-house for the parish, request made to the separate **school** board on Tuesday, March 2.
- daily attendance at Fr. Heintzmann's "poor kitchen" exceeds 180 persons.

ABSTRACT Sketch of St. Vincent de Paul Parish by Fr. Minehan:

- 1914 first chapel for parish was a store, a month or so after the first Mass, an adjoining store was added
- during the week one of the stores was used as a hall and **school** room (Chinese laundry now occupies the store which was used as a chapel)
- 1915 meeting held, agreed on Grecian architecture, copies in a general way the Madelaine of Paris, France.
- a young architect J.M. Cowan, who lived in an adjoining parish prepared a drawing which gave entire satisfaction.
- WWI was in its second year and owing to scarcity of material rising prices and youthfulness of parish, it was resolved to construct the basement for the present, cornerstone laid Sunday, August 15, 1915 by Abp. McNeil, who also officiated at the dedication of the basement church on Sunday, October 24, 1915.
- basement church served parish for 7 years.
- today (1923) there exists a modern 4 room **school** house (succeeding 2 **school** rooms partitioned off in the basement church)
